FROM THE PASTOR

Last year, before Paradise Lutheran's tenth anniversary, I had expressed a wish that Paradise Lutheran would thrive for the next hundred years. That this congregation would continue to thrive, and grow, and survive beyond any single person's life in the room. But in order to do that, we have to build up the next generation of Christians. And while we may not have many youth or young adults of our own, we can still help. So, for my March newsletter, I would like to share a letter from Pastor Sarah Locke, Campus Minister in Jacksonville, FL:

There is one clear indicator of young people heading into ministry in the ELCA: participation in camp or campus ministry.

Studies show that young people need positive, regular faith interactions with at least five adults in order to stick with their faith after high school (Fuller Youth Institute). Campus ministry is often the link between high school youth groups and congregational engagement as young adults.

Thankfully, the ELCA is engaged and committed to campus ministry across the United States. "ELCA campus ministry is a Lutheran ministry for students, faculty, staff, and others on campus, not just a ministry for Lutherans. It provides an ELCA presence at more than 180 state and private colleges and universities with cooperating congregations in campus ministry at an additional 400 campuses nationwide" (ELCA.org).

I grew up in the Lutheran church and attended my grandfather's congregation while attending college, but it was Ohio State's Lutheran campus ministry that led me to seminary and eventually to Jacksonville Campus Ministry at the University of North Florida. Jacksonville Campus Ministry was founded in 1972 by a coalition of churches and judicatories of six denominations— Christian (Disciples of Christ), Episcopal, Lutheran (ELCA), Presbyterian (PCUSA), United Church of Christ, and United Methodist. JCM's original mission was to serve all Jacksonville campuses.

There is a misconception that young people are unfaithful or simply uninterested in God. We have found that this is not the case at all. They are intensely curious about faith and God's action in their lives. Our students often come from religious households or congregations that denied their questions and doubts. By the time students arrive at college, their faith may be a swirl of questions that no one has taken the time to answer.

That is why campus ministry is so vitally important in the mission of the church. Young people 18-25 years old need a place to ask hard questions, be vulnerable in the midst of change, and love one another and themselves, all while learning about God's unchanging love for them and creation. It is our experience that campus ministry is often that space for young people.

You may not know that Jacksonville Campus Ministry is one of only two Lutheran campus ministries in the Florida-Bahamas Synod, despite the synod having more college students than any other synod in the ELCA. It is our hope that through JCM's example, the Church may see the importance and potential for campus ministry throughout the conferences and synod. In that way, our ministry is not just a ministry of the First Coast Conference or Jacksonville, but a ministry of each congregation in the entire synod.

There are many ways to be engaged with the young people of our synod, including supporting campus ministries across the state. We covet your prayers as we continue to grow this ministry and emphasize its importance to our church leaders. Thank you Paradise Lutheran for hosting our second Nokumbaya Medical Mission fundraiser dinner on Saturday, January 19, 2019. As many of you know, Paradise Lutheran has been a supporter of Nokumbaya for the past several years, and many members on PLC have been volunteers on our medical mission trips: Rolf Pagel, Herb Karkheck, Joan Smith, Ellen Fine, Marilyn Wambold, Nancy Farrington, Renee Diebler, Gail Clark, Debbie Reiter, and Danell DeBerg.

Our Nokumbaya mission statement is to provide medical care to the poor and needy of third world countries and to so in a manner that serves and praises God. Our service is our worship, and we seek to see Jesus in the face of each person we serve. We also hope and pray that the love and unity among the members of our team reflect His love for all people.

We serve four villages in Belize and two villages in Haiti. We return to the same places yearly in Haiti and twice a year in Belize, so that we can become part of the community we serve, recognize the needs and progress, and come to know the people. Our team is made up of volunteers from all over the U.S. and Canada, local Belizeans and Haitians, an occasional German, Russian, or Brit, and the village health workers who carry on after we leave.

You do not have to have a medical background in order to serve. We have lots of opportunity for lay volunteers in our school clinics. Please let me know if you are interested in participating. If you feel called, there is a place for you.

In 2019 we will have teams going to Belize in March and April, to Haiti in May, and back to Belize for a two week clinic in October.
