MESSAGE FROM PASTOR

Dear Paradise Lutheran Church,

I know some of you are curious about when we will be able to gather again in the sanctuary. The decisions of when to resume in sanctuary worship, and what those worship services will look like, are going to be difficult ones. These decisions are ultimately going to be made by Paradise Lutheran Church's council. We will do our best to make informed and knowledgeable decisions that are the best for our congregation.

On May 22nd, Bishop Suarez sent a letter in response to President's Trump call for churches to immediately resume in sanctuary worship. I have included that letter in our newsletter this month. I think Bishop Saurez's letter captures the importance of us being careful, not only as individuals, but as a congregation. And that while I like some of you are getting restless to return to in sanctuary worship, it is paramount that we take the time, and make sure proper preparations are made before we resume in sanctuary services.

In the meantime, we will continue to provide online and drive-in worship. And continue to seek ways to keep our community connected to each other and to God.

Bishop Suarez's Response to

President Trump

May 22, 2020

This afternoon, President Donald Trump declared that all governors should open churches immediately and said that churches should be considered essential businesses. I want to offer some reflection on this and how it affects us in the Florida-Bahamas Synod.

I want to remind you that churches are already listed as essential businesses in Florida. Governor DeSantis does not prevent any of us from worshipping. Because of the separation of church and state, the government cannot prevent us from worshipping, or compel us to worship, at any time. However, it is strongly recommended by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and the Florida Department of Health that in this "Phase 1" of our reopening, we limit public gatherings as much as possible.

In the Florida-Bahamas Synod, my recommendation is that congregations wait until at least "Phase 3" of statewide reopening before they return to in-person worship. When we are finally able to gather, we recommend continuing to follow safe distancing practices, including wearing masks, staying six feet apart, and cleaning and disinfecting the sanctuary after services. The ELCA and our Synod's guidelines are available on our webpage www.fbsynod.com.

We do not recommend our congregations begin to gather at this time, but legally, you can. Most of our congregations have decided not to have in-person services out of concern for the health and safety of their members. Those that have decided to try and have services are encouraged to use social distancing procedures and avoid practices which can contribute to the spread of the virus, such as singing, shaking hands, passing the peace, or distributing Holy Communion.

COVID-19 is a national emergency, but returning to in-person services is not yet a priority at this time. We urge you to continue doing services online for the time being, until we are in "Phase 3" or upon recommendation from the CDC.

My ultimate recommendation is that we continue to hold off on in-person worship until, at least, "Phase 3" of reopening. For those who have decided to try and have services, we strongly recommend following the safe meeting practices and continuing to uphold social distancing. In all of this we continue to encourage you to pray for each other, for our communities, for our nation and

The President's announcement could encourage people to want to follow his advice and open the congregations this weekend. I would strongly recommend against that. I think there is too much risk for a congregation to safely gather this weekend unless they have had a proper amount of time to put policies and procedures in place to protect their members. It would be dangerous to rush in when we have time to plan and make the best decisions for our congregations.

Sisters and Brothers, I continue to thank God for you. Thank you for the way you care for each other and for your congregations in this time.

May God be with you.

We estimated about 28 vehicles lined up on the east side of the parking lot. Our best guess is 67 attended. Cute little individual communion cups enabled us to have both wafer and grape juice. Although there were a few glitches regarding the FM transmitter, it was a good first try and you could tell members of the congregation were glad to see each other, even if they were spaced at least a car apart.

The second drive-in service on May 17 went considerably smoother with the FM transmitter broadcasting to a different station. Additional volunteers included David, Stephanie, and Justin Leslie at the offering table. 50 attended.

Our third drive-in service was on May 24, Ascension Day. It was cloudy with temperatures in the low 80's and a breeze from the north, so it was pretty pleasant. New volunteers included Kathy Rabey, song leader, and Taylor Leslie, usher. 55 attended. Pastor encouraged everybody to paint their cars red for next week's Pentecost service. You'll have to wait until the next newsletter to see how that turned out.

Children's sermons continued on-line on Wednesdays May 6, May 14, and May 23. If you haven't been to church lately (and I'm thinking that's our winter visitors and associate members who escaped before the coronavirus hit), you would not believe how grown up Jo has become. 


Instructions

Print and cut out the cards along the lines. Then you can do all sorts of things with the uplifting cards.


- Write a note on the back and give it to a neighbor or mail it to someone who is alone.

 - Laminate the cards to make them last longer.




