O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; God's steadfast love endures forever. (Psalm 136:1)

I was humbled by the generous gifts I received for "Pastor Appreciation Sunday." I continue to thank God for the fact that I was called to be the pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church and that I was given the opportunity to serve as the vice pastor of Hope Lutheran Church.

Back in 2014, many Lutheran congregations were unwilling to call an openly gay man; Trinity recognized and has appreciated the gifts that I bring. More recently, when faced with an existential crisis, Hope was willing to entrust themselves to my care. Amid all of the stress of the past two years of the merger process, I have come to believe that we have a bright future together.

Trinity is now ONE congregation that worships and serves God in TWO locations. I am learning to call our Fifth Street North location our "historic downtown campus" and the 62nd Avenue North location our "new Meadowlawn campus."

For the sake of strengthening relationships (and to preserve my health!) it is essential that we move as quickly as possible to have only one worship on a Sunday morning. After conversation with our church staff, particularly our music directors, I think the best time for Sunday worship is 10:30.

If you have a compelling reason why we should worship earlier or later, let me know. But this time will allow us to have a choir practice before worship and ample time for fellowship and for adult education and/or confirmation classes after worship.

Sunday worship will move back and forth between our two campuses. My proposal is to have worship at the downtown location on the first two Sundays of each month and at the Meadowlawn location on all of the remaining Sundays of each month.

I am asking that this schedule begin on Sunday, November 23, when Pastor Frederick Bartelt will preach and preside over worship for Christ the King Sunday. This service will be at the Meadowlawn campus at 10:30.

Worship on November 30, the First Sunday of Advent, will also be at Meadowlawn at 10:30; worship on December 7 and 14 will be at the downtown campus at 10:30. The other Sundays in December will return to Meadowlawn.

Christmas Eve services will be on both campuses. Last year's pattern worked well, so, our earlier service will take place downtown with a later service at Meadowlawn.

The people who have served as lectors reading scripture and as communion assistants need to be consolidated onto one schedule. Please call a church office and let us know if you want to continue to be on our growing roster of worship assistants. This is a good time to add yourself to their ranks. Helping in these capacities, working with our altar guild, singing and playing bells, and assisting with fellowship are how we make worship a work that is shared by all of God's people.

As we move into the seasons of Advent and Christmas, my prayer is that we will all experience how "God's steadfast love endures forever."

Giving Thanks for All Things

It's easy to list the blessings in life: good health, family, a satisfying career, a comfortable home. We might even be thankful for things others take for granted such as freedom and clean drinking water, reliable transportation and food enough to eat. Then there are the little things, such as gardens, sunrises, pets and coffee. But what about life's storms or unanswered prayers? Should we be thankful for these? Loss and hardship remind us of our dependence on God. He uses trials to draw us closer to him, to show us that He is our rock and refuge. In misfortune and grief, we discover God's comfort and strength. Should we not, then, be thankful for the storms, too?

Blessed Assurance


Tune composer Phoebe Palmer Knapp (1839-1908) played a melody to Fanny Crosby and asked, "What does the melody say to you?" Crosby replied that the tune said, "Blessed assurance, Jesus is mine!" and proceeded to recite the entire first stanza of the now-famous hymn. Knapp was one of several tune writers that worked with Fanny Crosby. It was not unusual for

one of her texts to be inspired by a preexisting tune. Knapp was the composer of more than five hundred gospel hymns and tunes.

Fanny Crosby (1820-1915), blind at the age of six weeks, was a lifelong Methodist who began composing hymns at age six. She became a student at the New York Institute of the Blind at age 15 and joined the faculty of the Institute at 22, teaching rhetoric and history.

An author of more than 8,000 gospel hymn texts, she drew her inspiration from her own faith. Crosby published hymns under several pen names including "Ella Dale," "Mrs. Kate Gringley," and "Miss Viola V. A." Her hymn texts were staples for the music of the most prominent gospel song writers of her day. "Blessed Assurance" (1873) is one of the ten most popular hymns sung by United Methodists.

Crosby captured the poetic essence of the Wesleyan



understanding of Christian perfection in the phrase, "O what a foretaste of glory divine!" The entire hymn is focused on heaven, a place where "perfect submission" and "perfect delight" [stanza 2] will take place. The earthly existence is one of "watching and waiting, looking above" [stanza 3]. As we submit ourselves to Christ and are "filled

with his goodness" and "lost in his love" [stanza 3], we are remade in Christ's image and are moving toward Christian perfection.

This hymn appeals to the senses in a rich way. Not only do we have a "foretaste of glory," we experience "visions of rapture [that] burst on my sight," and we hear "echoes of mercy, whispers of love" [stanza 2]. The refrain calls us to "prais[e]. . . my Savior all the day long," echoing I Thessalonians 5:17, "Pray without ceasing."

Middle class women in nineteenth-century United States had little voice in worship, however. One of the only ways for a woman to claim the authority to be heard was by direct personal revelation from God. Fanny Crosby readily claimed God's personal revelation as a source for her hymns; her personal revelation then became a communal inspiration as Christians throughout the world sang her hymns and confirmed her faith experience as their own.

Common Council Highlights (items discussed at both locations)

Worship Services:

- We will move to a single worship service beginning on 11/23 (Christ the King Sunday), at which Frederick Bartelt will preside. This service will be held at the Meadowlawn facility at 10:30am.
- Going forward (in Advent and beyond), the 10:30am Sunday service will be preceded by our choir practice and will be followed by fellowship time that leads into adult education. Our Downtown facility will host the services on the first two Sundays of the month; our Meadowlawn facility will host the services on the remaining Sundays of the month.
- No mid-week worship in Advent, but everyone is encouraged to participate in the Advent by Candlelight event that is being planned for 2pm on Nov 30th.
- Thanksgiving Eve service will be at 7pm at the Meadowlawn facility.

Bible Study:

- Current study series: "Why the Bible" intended to address how and why we read and study the scriptures.
- In Advent: The Gospel of Matthew
- New Year: ABCs of Healthy Grieving

Merger:

- The initial draft of a document giving a very high level side-by-side view of the financial position of both Trinity and Hope was reviewed and discussed. The document had been requested by Alan Due. The purpose of the document is to ensure that all members have a better understanding of the church's financial position.
- Looking to plan a retreat day for the combined council (post-merger, if it passes). Possibly 11/11 or 11/15, stay tuned.
- Question: do we need to keep QuickBooks in order to stay with General Accounting Services? Angie to research.
- Foundry Group: Carlin Beekman, VP Mission Property Group will be worshiping with both congregations on 11/2 and will speak afterwards on how her team can help us develop a plan for our properties as a merged congregation to further our mission. All recommendations from her team will be derived through the lens of our church's mission and vision.

Additional Discussions at Hope (10/21/25)

Thrift Store: Overflowing. We are passing items on to other organizations every day. YTD earnings: \$4196! **Month of Caring:**

Roof and Solar Update:

- Solar plans require revisions due to exhaust issues and Fire Department requirements.

Miscellaneous:

- Bees have been moved.

- How about a rain garden (drainage)

- Homeless policy will be tabled until post-merger.
- Nov 29 @ 9am: Christmas cleaning and setup.
- An issue was raised regarding the volume of the music during the service. Ross will try to lower it some.

Additional Discussions at Trinity (10/21/25)

Membership: requests approved for two new members: Hayden Fulton & Kelly Osborne

Landmark Status: Grant opportunities are being reviewed. All Trades may be able to help us identify additional options. We had applied for one grant (11 to Save) this year, but did not get it. We will try again in 2026. We will also follow up on the process to ascertain the value of any TDRs that are available to us with our landmarked property.

City Church: Pr. Paul worked with City Church on needs and agreement to lease. He presented council with a "first draft" of a lease agreement drafted by City Church. This is NOT a final document! Pastor will create an editable document of the draft for council members to review and return with any questions or suggestions. Space usage and alternate spaces for storage were discussed.

Facility Use: Karen and Alan will work on creating an alternate facilities calendar to show all groups, meetings, events, and use of the downtown church properties.



I am a local from the town of Gulfport, Fla. My parents, Raymond and Kathleen (Kitty), had met in Newport News, VA during WWII. My dad was from Polk County Fla and in the Coast Guard and mother was from North Carolina and worked in the shipyard offices. They eventually ended up coming back to Florida. My Dad went to work for his brother Thea who owned Florida Builders and was developing portions of Gulfport, the beaches, and what is now the Meadowlawn area.

My first job I can remember having — I was about 12 or 13 — was mowing vacant land in Meadowlawn with an old International Harvester tractor and that would include the land where Hope Lutheran is currently located. At the time, 62nd Ave was a dirt road that only extended as far as Haines Road.

I graduated from Boca Ciega High School in 1970 with my classmate, Daryl Stewart, where we also played football. We were a year behind Jim Bertoluzzi and a year ahead of Carol. After high school I served in the U.S. Air Force mostly in California and Asia. After my discharge I returned to Florida and worked several jobs in Jacksonville and St Pete and after a few years decided to enroll at St Petersburg Jr College where I graduated. After graduation I enrolled at USF and majored in secondary education. While taking these courses I was recruited by two of my high school coaches to assist them at brand new Pinellas Park High School, it was a lot of fun.

While I was going to USF, I took a temporary job at St Pete Printing doing the phone books for GTE Directories. I worked in the press room and bindery. They offered me a fulltime position which later led to a management position and my moving to the publishing office. I moved back and forth between publishing and printing for several years until I became the eastern region publishing manager. Oh, and that's when I met a wonderful lady who had moved to St Pete to be a trainer for our office. Her name is Leah Heinicke. You may know her. I retired from the publishing company in 2005. Just figured I'd do more fishing and playing golf.

I started coming to Trinity full time after the pandemic, I felt that coming just on Christmas or other holidays wasn't enough and wanted more. I enjoy Trinity and being part of this blessed and wonderful congregation. I appreciate the welcome you have shown me and hope I have shown it in return.


Gratitude Shift

CIRCLE — The circle is a symbol for God, as well as for eternity, due to its lack of a beginning or an end. It also reminds us of how the church year (not unlike the secular

calendar) flows from season to season and moves smoothly from Christ the King Sunday (the culmination of the liturgical calendar) to the First Sunday of Advent (a new beginning). Indeed, the One who rules all is the same One whose first and final comings we anticipate anew during Advent.
