On March 24th & 25th the members and friends of Prince of Peace worked tirelessly to help others in our community. More than 165 volunteers (ages 5 to 100) provided over 500 hours of support for 25 projects, which included these and more:



Food for over 200 people – cooked, carried, blessed and served for Pinellas Hope, Ronald McDonald House, Kimberly Home moms & our own hardworking helpers.

Love and warmth in 176 baby blankets for infants in the neonatal intensive care unit at All Children's Hospital, 11 quilts for Lutheran World Relief, and 19 fleece lap blankets for the veterans at the VA.

Comfort and care in **80 Bear Essentials bags** for children in Lutheran Services Foster Care, **100 Hope Kits** for the homeless in our community, and **172 greeting cards** for our homebound and for military service personnel.

The forms are due back at the church office by April 18th (Tax Day). The Endowment Board members will meet in May (and June) to decide which requests we are able to fund, and hope to be able to distribute to charities beginning in July. So, thoroughly describe your program and what you want to

accomplish for them in your request. The idea is to provide support for those outside of our congregation. These requests are specifically to not fund day-today ministries within Prince of Peace, and we cannot provide "seed funding" for anything that the Congregation Council has not already approved.

- Heard presentation from Pr. Webb regarding the Mission Possible Capital Campaign of NovusWay Ministries (our camp ministries): after discussion, voted to explore an approach to the campaign here

- Heard report that roof replacement over kitchen and choir room will begin April 17
- Voted to approve Carolyn Glasgow, Virginia Higgins and Pamela Iusi to serve as the Financial Review Committee

BISHOP SCHAEFER'S RESIGNATION CHANGES SCHEDULE

The past couple of months have been challenging for the Florida Bahamas Synod. As most of you know, Bishop Robert Schaefer announced his resignation in February, effective March 5. Below is a paragraph from a brief note that he sent to rostered leaders. His letter making the formal announcement has been posted here at the church for weeks.

"After several months of struggling with this, I have made a decision necessary for my own well-being going forward. While it has been a privilege and joy to serve as bishop of this synod for the past 3 ½ years, it has taken a toll on me personally and spiritually that I can no longer ignore. After much soul searching and conversation with the family over the holidays, I have decided to step down as bishop."

Soon we will welcome the Rev. Marcus Lohrmann to serve as our Interim Bishop. For 18 years Pr. Lohrmann served as Bishop of the Northwestern Ohio Synod, retiring in 2016. Prior to that he served as pastor in three different congregations.

What happens now? The annual Synod Assembly scheduled to take place in June has been cancelled and rescheduled. Rostered leaders Conference on Ministry, an annual continuing education event which normally takes place in the fall, has also been cancelled. An Assembly for the purpose of electing a new bishop and other business will convene in Kissimmee on October 12-14.

Let us continue in our prayers for the Synod Council and other leaders of our Synod as they carry out their duties and seek to lead us now and in the months ahead.
