# POP PRESCHOOL RECEIVES HIGH EDUCATION RANKING



As a school that serves students receiving government support for childcare (School Readiness), we were observed by the Early Learning Coalition to assess the quality of services that our school provides.

This assessment program is The Performance Funding Project (PFP) which rewards School Readiness providers with additional funds for meeting increased quality standards. Childcare centers teachers and family childcare home providers participate in quality improvement strategies such as specialized training, professional development, coaching and child assessment practices. This "pay for performance" pilot project is designed to award providers for achieving and maintaining high level of quality as indicated by the Classroom Scoring Assessment System (CLASS).

Providers are assigned to a tier based on a composite score from their CLASS assessment.

Each level of proficiency has different support strategies designed to improve or maintain the quality of services provided to the children in care, such as professional development opportunities, the creation of a career pathway, implementation of child assessments, coaching and technical assistance.

Providers in tiers two and above receive a higher child (School Readiness) reimbursement. We received the news that we were leveled at tier 4 (the tier system is a ranking system with tier 1 being low and tier 5 being high). We couldn't be prouder of this achievement! It is nice to be validated for the work we do day to day with our children. *God is with us!*

Once again, Prince of Peace is pleased to offer a preventive health event. Life Line Screening, a leading provider of community-based preventive screenings, will host their affordable, non-invasive and painless health screenings. Five screenings will be offered that scan for potential health problems related to: blocked arteries, a leading cause of stroke; abdominal aortic aneurysms; peripheral vascular screening of the legs; atrial fibrillation or irregular heart beat which is closely tied to stroke risk; and bone density screening, used to assess the risk of osteoporosis.
