“I AM,” JESUS SAID. REALLY?

Lent is an ancient season of walking the road, following our Lord. It has its traditional disciplines: prayer, fasting, acts of charity. The Church has gone through periods where we have focused our Lenten “journeys” on contemplating the cross or pondering what it means to be a follower of this One who has come for us.

Either way, have we ever taken time to consider just what our Lord says about himself? The world around us seems to think it knows just who Jesus is. “He said a lot of good things.” “He was brave. He died for what he believed in.” “He was a good man and helped many people.” “He was a prophet of God.”

But is that all? Christians often seem confident that they know Jesus. But have you ever really considered the kinds of things he said about himself? If someone said those kinds of things these days, can you imagine how the media, public officials and even various groups of Christians would react?

One of the most intriguing puzzles of gospel writer, John, is his recording of our Lord’s “I AM” declarations. Unlike Matthew, Mark and Luke, in John Jesus makes 7 statements that begin, “I AM.” In conversations with women or with his disciples, while talking with crowds and his skeptics, our Lord tells them “I AM living bread” or “I AM the light of the world” and much more.

Really? How would you explain that to your friends who do not believe? What does that mean for us who say “I believe...” at Creed time each week?

In Lent during our Noon Responsive Prayer and 7 PM Evening Prayer times, we will explore together these curious declarations by Jesus our Lord and what they mean for all of us followers and even for all the world.

TRANSFIGURATION OF OUR LORD — SUNDAY, MARCH 3

We follow a Church Year in our worship and life here at Prince of Peace, which means we have seasons and special days. They encourage us to experience our Lord in different ways. March 3 is the Transfiguration of our Lord. This Sunday brings to a close the days since the Epiphany of our Lord [those magi paying a visit to the Christ Child] January 6.

On the Sunday after Epiphany day, we heard the voice of the Almighty declaring over a freshly baptized Jesus, “This is my Son....” Now at this end of these post Epiphany days, when our Lord is transfigured on the mountaintop with 3 disciples, the Almighty once again says “This is my Son...listen to him.” It’s a curious event on that peak, well-worth our listening again and pondering.

The Transfiguration of our Lord means we are close to Lent’s beginning. Come, let’s join together in our songs of praise and farewell to the Alleluia at the close of our worship.

ASH WEDNESDAY — March 6 at Noon & 7:00 PM



Ash Wednesday is the starting point of a journey that takes us through Lent and into Holy Week, the great center of the Church Year, and then the blessed time of Easter.

In this most solemn time of worship, we receive the mark of ashes on our foreheads, and hear that we are indeed dust and to dust we shall return. We hear as well that we belong to a God who is holy, who does not see things as we do, and yet who has come for us and saved us from ourselves.

We will confess how we have fallen short of our Lord’s way, receive ashes, words of encouragement and food from our Lord’s Table to strengthen us for the journey. Let us come, even bring a friend, to Ash Wednesday and enter together into a new Lenten season.

LENT AT PRINCE OF PEACE

To use a popular turn of phrase these days, we are 24/7 followers of Christ Jesus. After all, when we are baptized into our Lord, we belong to the Lord. We are followers of Christ any time—of every day. It’s just that we sometimes are so absorbed in getting that work project completed, helping with homework, taxiing to the next appointment [you know the drill!] that we forget even to pray before supper.

Lent is the Church Year’s great reminder. There is discipline in this life of faith. We don’t really like hearing that word, “discipline.” But it’s true. Reading the scriptures, prayer, gathering with others for worship, discussing what and why we believe are all parts of the life we share in Christ.

For centuries the Church has observed particular Lenten disciplines: prayer, fasting and acts of mercy. They can be a part of our living in other seasons, no doubt. But Lent is the great reminder, remember? This season draws us more intentionally into the faith that we share. It encourages us to ponder together our Lord’s gift of himself and what being his followers means for us every day, in every decision, through every sorrowful or joyful time

Let’s walk together through Lent and into the glorious blessings of Easter!

Prepare

At a recent meeting the consultant in our strategic planning effort recounted his worship experience with us. “You really sing here!” he said. He experienced energy, a liveliness in his time with us in worship.

We all know that when we come together to worship the Lord God, it does not just happen. Friends clean linens and “set the table.” Acolytes light candles and assist with other tasks. Worship assistants read [which takes practice ahead of time] and serve Holy Communion. The Parish Musician assembles the choirs for rehearsals on Tuesday and Wednesday nights; they meet before worship time on Sunday and support our song. Sometimes, more musicians add to the joy. Ushers make certain that folk are greeted, even before they enter the sanctuary, and provide directions, along with other greeters. And yes, the pastors prepare, too. All these friends prepare to support the prayers and praises of God’s people coming here—to turn our undivided attention to the Almighty, because the Lord our God is worthy of all our worship. Isn’t that why we worship?

So what about you? Do you prepare for worship, too? Each week our bulletin also has in it the scripture passages for worship time, too. We can read them before we come.

We can pray for all who will be leading us. We can enter into the sanctuary and, in the beauty of that holy time, reflect on a hymn, a reading or prayers in the front of the ELW, as we await worship’s beginning. We can give ourselves over to every movement of our worship time, responding passionately in prayers and dialogues, making a joyful noise in song.

Recently, I saw a child stretch out from the pews on Mom’s hand and dance during the Offertory. Another little guy literally sprinted up for the children’s message. A frequent worshipper who isn’t a “member” commented on how there’s “nothing like this Lutheran liturgy,” noting that what is old becomes new again each time we come together. He’s right!

Prepare for worship! Know that when you arrive you are entering into God’s presence yet again with all of the sisters and brothers. And give yourself over to each movement of the morning, as you speak and sing, listen and “amen”—with energy!


FIRST COMMUNION
