## ELCA BORDER IMMERSION TRIP

ighty young adults applied for the ELCA Young Adult Border Immersion Trip and 15 were selected. The trip was made possible through the collaborative efforts of Border Servant Corps, Lutheran Immigrant Refugee Service, ELCA Advocacy, and ELCA Young Adults. Kristen Theile had the honor to be selected. This experience is an accompaniment-style immersion program, where the participants heard first hand educational experiences about border issues. Throughout their experience, the group embarked on profound exploration of the complexities surrounding immigration. They were granted unique opportunities to engage with and learn from first-generation immigrants, visit local organizations and churches dedicated to supporting immigrant populations, hold meaningful discussions with government officials regarding border protection and law enforcement, and gain insights into immigration law and the economic policies that shape the realities faced by individuals residing along the border. By immersing themselves

in the stories and experiences of those directly affected, the participants sought to cultivate a deep understanding of the challenges and realities faced by individuals at the border.

This transformative experience left an indelible mark on each participant, expanding their knowledge, and nurturing their dedication through faith for a more just and compassionate approach to immigration. 
#### PRECAUTIONARY PLANNING

## **HURRICANE SEASON**

s As Floridians, we are well aware that from June 1st to November 1st, we are in the midst of hurricane season and it is not too early to be prepared. You can take the necessary steps to build your emergency kit, familiarize yourself with storm related terms, make accommodations for any special needs, ensure the safety of your pets, and secure your home. It is important to have an evacuation plan, especially for families living in mobile home communities. For those PoP families that live in mobile home communities, an evacuation plan is essential. In the event of an evacuation order, typically issued by local officials or the governor, it is important to remain calm and put your emergency plan into action. Determine where you will seek shelter, whether it be a motel, hotel, with family or friend's house located outside the storm affected area.

Moreover, if you are willing and able to house a PoP member, we kindly ask that you let us know. We're compiling a list of potential hosts, just in case it becomes necessary. Stay safe and be proactive.
