

PREPARING FOR HOLY WEEK

everal years ago on Palm Sunday, I drove home from church and got out of the car. I saw crows sitting in a tree and on the roof of a neighboring apartment. I didn't know what was going on but the crows were making a lot of noise. They began diving toward the ground and that worried me. I walked over to where the crows were landing and saw a baby bird in the grass crying out. I didn't know what had happened but the baby bird was injured. I felt so helpess. Then I realized there was another baby bird about twenty feet away on the ground. I tried to herd the baby birds into the nearby bushes for protection, but the baby birds kept coming back onto the grass calling for help, calling for a parent.

Some neighbors asked me what I was doing. I told them about the baby birds on the ground. One woman said, "You can pick them up." Well, the nest was way up in the tree. The neighbors moved on but the crows stayed, watching and waiting. Adult birds were trying to drive away the crows. I know it would not end well. I could not stand to watch. It was Palm Sunday and my heart was already heavy. Palm Sunday reminds me of a parade that ended badly.

The next morning I walked outside, afraid to look around. The crows were still hanging around. Against the blue sky, I saw one crow with something dangling from its beak - a dead baby bird. I don't know which was worse, knowing what would happen or seeing the reality.


I started thinking about God our Father watching Jesus. Watching Jesus refusing to give into temptation as death came closer. Watching the jeering crowds.



Watching Jesus nailed on the cross. Watching his blood poured out for the world. Hearing his son say, 'My God, my God why have you forsaken me?" Hearing him breathe his last breath. Watching him taken down from the cross and buried in a tomb.

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son." I can hardly take it in.

CALL COMMITTEE CATCH UP

Change can happen quickly or it can seem as "slow as molasses!" We have had times of both at PoP, haven't we? These Lenten days are full of both. Your Call Committee has been interviewing prospective candidates once again; does it seem like "How long, O Lord?" Maybe—BUT! The really good news and a very recent change is that we have identified a Primary Candidate and that person has agreed to be our Primary Candidate. That means soon the process will go forward with other new steps.

The Call Committee will be meeting with the Congregational Council in April to give them our report in detail. Then their discernment kicks into high gear.

But there is a time of "pause" ahead for us and the candidate. We (and the candidate's congregation) will have a short April hiatus from additional steps in this process while we pray, fast, and serve others during Lent. I can tell you from the interviews that prospective pastors LOVE to see PoP continuing their service to



the community! There are many opportunities here to serve and celebrate during April. And then we celebrate his resurrection at Easter. He is risen indeed!

SETUP YOUR ONLINE GIVING ACCOUNT



Online giving is not replacing our traditional method of providing envelopes for our tithes and offerings, this is just another option available. 
SUN, APR 6 / 2-4PM / COC, PEACE ROOM LWR QUILTING 101

THURS, APR 24 / 7PM BOOKED FOR DESSERT


