ASKED AND ANSWERED

hen we came to Prince of Peace back in the spring, we invited you to participate in a group activity with us, allowing us to hear your reflections about where this congregation has been and where we might be headed together. You participated faithfully and your responses have been really helpful as we continue to get acclimated to ministry with PoP. I'd like to share a quick summary of those thoughts, compiled by Pr. Rachel and me as we read them. Here are the themes we spotted:

You want to invite more people. This theme came up again and again from the various responses we received. Sometimes it was aimed at a particular demographic, like when a desire for more young people was

expressed. Other times, the goal was broader, emphasizing an appreciation for what we have and a desire to share it. This is a great goal! Being new ourselves, Pr. Rachel and I agree that PoP is a community that is well worth the time required to participate. Now, obviously, growing means we will be changing a bit. This is a good thing! We can grow as much as we are willing to incorporate the gifts and ideas of the new people who join us. Each new gift and idea can serve as validation that, indeed, God is leading us into a new future. We know that which is new can feel like a threat sometimes, but it doesn't have to. Instead, we can just remind one another: growth requires growth, so let's see what God is up to.

You want to volunteer, to say 'Yes' to new opportunities. We saw several responses that reflected a desire to 'pitch in' if asked. This is an encouraging thing to read and it will be all the more encouraging to see taking shape in the coming weeks and months. Remember, the more we participate, the more we will grow in faith, and grow closer together, too. And I might as well add, there's no need to wait to be asked! Tell us what you'd like to do and we will work with you to find a way to use your gifts for God's glory!

You appreciate fellowship here with the PoP family. So many of your responses included appreciative words about Wednesdays Together, special events, and all kinds of opportunities to be church together. This is clearly a congregation that likes to work together, but also to play, sing, laugh, cry, and live together. This is what Jesus has intended for the church in his name since the beginning. A congregation cannot be sustained with a bunch of individual connections to the pastor(s); it needs to be interconnected, with people showing care for one another. We welcome each and every effort you put forth to extend pastoral care to the other members of PoP - anyone can be pastoral and everyone should give it a try each day!

You are open to new ideas. You don't want any change at all. Do those two statements seem contradictory? Well, they are. Nevertheless, there were several responses reflecting each of those ideas. Perhaps you will get the sense that there is no way to satisfy both perspectives. Fortunately, we only need to worry about satisfying God's desire for our community of faith. This will mean some change - God always, always instigates some change in the people. Yet at the same time, some things are continually true. We change the hymns every week, but we are always singing something, right? This kind of thing happens in all aspects of ministry, where the core value remains at the center of what we do, even when we adjust our approach to meet some emerging need. When you are overwhelmed by some change taking place, talk to us! We are here to help you navigate whatever may shift. When you are frustrated by a lack of change, we invite conversation for that, too. PoP is not going to be totally different overnight, but it will continue to evolve as all healthy, living things do. Most importantly, we will do this together.

Outreach is important to this congregation. This perspective is already evident in the space PoP has made for Ruth's Promise and the Preschool, to say nothing of the continuing efforts of Go and Do Likewise, the work of Hunger Task Force, and so many initiatives (space precludes the list). We felt called to this place in no small part because we knew it to be a generous congregation, concerned that the Kingdom of God would flourish beyond the walls of the church property and within them, too.

You want things from the new pastors, too. You want us to provide leadership, strong worship experiences, stability, vision, congregational care, youth leadership (and growth), and a great deal more. Fortunately, this list hits most of our passions and gifts. We are called to provide these things as your pastors, but part of those calls is helping you answer yours at PoP, too! Our strengths will be used in ways that bring these things out of the people who have been here before us and those who will join after us, too. That's the key to successful, healthy ministry - we have to share it for it to work! We will present

opportunities for the people of PoP to grow in these ways and develop their strengths for leading worship, leading on Council, visioning collaboratively, providing care, creating stability (while avoiding stagnation), and continually finding ways to minister to (and with) the Youth and Children of this congregation.

This is only a brief overview of what your participation produced, and it only covers two listening events. We know you have more to say and more to offer, so do not think the conversation is over - not by a long shot! For now, thank you for taking the time to offer your thoughts and read the thoughts of others. If you'd like to see the full breakdown of the responses, please let the church office know.

We hope seeing these responses in summary will be for you what it has been for us: encouragement. We are encouraged that the Holy Spirit has called us to a strong ministry together, one which is poised to continue to grow its impact in this community and in the lives of each person who claims this as their spiritual home.

PASTOR RACHEL'S REMARKS

We are still unpacking at our house, and I am still setting up my office - we are making good progress, but it's taking longer than I thought it would! I had visions of a week, maybe two, and things would all be neat and tidy in their places, and I'd feel settled in. I don't know why; we've done this before and it's never been that fast. Now, as we approach 4 weeks with our boxes, I am reminding myself to be patient, that getting things done well (rather than fast) is the way to go. If I cram everything into a closet so I can say the box is unpacked, I'm going to find myself on the floor under a pile of whatever fell back out when I opened that door later - which won't help anyone!

I'm feeling a bit the same about getting going at Prince of Peace. I know you all have been waiting a long time for a pastor to arrive, and I want to be fully up to speed! However (and fortunately), you also have a lot going on! And when there is a lot to know (people, programs, history, mission) it takes longer than we think to learn, and even longer to be able to do something with what we learn.

When pastors come into a new call, our goal is often to change as little as possible right away, unless it's truly necessary. This approach allows us to see what's working, ask questions, get to know people, and then work together to determine what's next. And at the same time, I want to jump in and help where I see opportunities. I know that some of you have been waiting for us to come and make changes! Here also I have to remind myself again: be patient. Like unpacking, it's important to be intentional with change, not rushed.

In unpacking with intention, I have found things that I forgot I had, that bring me joy! And I've also found things I can't believe I've kept for so long (Do I still need those flashcards from college? No, I do not.). I think we'll find ourselves doing the same here together, as you help us unpack what makes Prince of Peace the place and the people and it is. It may take a little longer than we all expected, but in the end, we're going to find ourselves well-equipped to chart a path for long-term ministry together, and I'm very excited about that!


SUN, SEPT 7 / 10AM ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

SEPT 26 / 10AM / PARISH HALL CARD PRAYER MINISTRY


