You never know who you're going to run into at church.

Last week, I was walking through the back of the Sanctuary building, in that hallway between the sacristy and the chapel, when I saw something moving quickly in front of me. I assumed it was just a strange shadow at first, but as I continued, so did the little shape. Two times, it kind of jumped up, bouncing off the side walls. I pulled out my cell phone to use the flashlight app, and that's when I realized that the shadow was a little lizard. I thought it was unfortunate that this creature ended up inside, but I went about my business. I made my way to the sacristy, got what I needed, and headed back the other way to leave. I was thinking about that lizard, though, and passed it again


on the way, careful not to step on it.
I thought to myself, "That little guy is doomed. If it can't find its way out again, it will become dehydrated and die." I also thought, "Thank God there are so many lizards. We can afford to lose a few."

This kind of thinking is all too common in the world. If we think beyond ourselves, we might notice the struggle all around us. Whether it's the tree that was massively cut for the sake of power lines, the animal losing its habitat, or the person experiencing a series of really rough breaks, life around us persists, but it struggles to do so. It's easy to look away, proceeding with our lives as though we never noticed. But, when we do, what do we do?

The weight of the world does not belong on any one person's shoulders. God is the only one who can hold all things together. Still, there are moments when opportunities present themselves in which we are able to take on a little of the creative, redemptive work of God, making things a little better. I have a theory about that. I think those opportunities are not presented as more tasks for our already busy lives, but at the very least, reminders that those lives are about more than ourselves. Perhaps you've been the recipient of someone's decision to show kindness when they

didn't need to. It is an uplifting thing, when somebody notices us, sees the struggle we face, and goes out of their way to lighten the load. Their kindness is a Christlike sacrifice that reminds us of the goodness present in God's children. And, hopefully, a reminder that we, too, can be Christlike.

There in the hallway behind the Sanctuary, I stopped. I had this strange but powerful thought that, if I were stuck in a building, with my demise being the most likely outcome, I would want someone to have a more charitable approach than, "Thank God there are so many pastors. We can afford to lose a few."

A few weeks ago, I preached about hospitality and our call to share the goodness we experience at God's table by inviting people to join us at Prince of Peace. 
POP PRESCHOOL


MATTHEW: TOGETHER BY GRACE




SUN, OCT 19 / 3PM / SANCTUARY CERUS SAXOPHONE QUARTET

ART FOR FAITH'S SAKE


Emerging as one of the most compelling chamber ensembles of their generation, hear both new music as well as timeless repertoire performed by four saxophones.
